

Suggested Equipment for Summer Campouts

Scout Book: There will be a lot of opportunities for us to sign off on advancements, but you must have your book with you. Additionally it is "The single **most** important piece of scouting equipment you own".

Change of clothes: Nylon pants are not a good choice, because they are more flammable than other materials. If you do wear Nylon you will **NOT** be around any fire. We are camping at places that sometimes the weeds are quite high. I would caution you about wearing shorts anyway.

Sleeping bag: If you do not have a sleeping bag, let Mr. Davey know ahead of time and we will make provisions for you.

Mattress pad &/or pillow: This is optional, but it can make your night more enjoyable.

Flashlight: We do provide lanterns, however they are extinguished when we go to bed, should you need to get up in the middle of the night, a flashlight is a good thing.

Rain Gear: A good thing to have on any campout. Even if it doesn't rain it can provide an extra layer if the temperature should drop.

Medications: If you require any special medicines, please remember to bring them with you and advise Mr. Davey. We can handle meds that need to be refrigerated if you let us know Monday **before** the campout. Medications will be dispersed by an adult leader. Scouts should not keep medications with them.

Bug Spray and Sun Screen: Per B.S.A. regulations these cannot be of the aerosol variety.

Class A Uniform: Boys while in transit to and from campouts must wear their Class A uniform this is required by B.S.A. regulations.

Cap, Hat, or Bandana: optional but can be helpful on a sunny day.

Pocket Knives: knives are to be carried and used ONLY after the Totin' Chip is earned. It may be packed in case the boys have completed or do complete these requirements. If it's out before earning the Totin' Chip or being used improperly it will be taken away.
